

 - If you finish before time is up, reread the questions and check your answers.









Established by Congress in 1992 under the FREEDOM Support Act following the collapse of the Soviet Union, the program provides merit-based scholarships for students from post-Soviet countries. Through person-to-person exchange, FLEX students learn about American society and values, acquire leadership skills, develop their sense of civic responsibility, and help educate Americans about their own countries and cultures. Invite an international student into your home—and watch how you all grow! These scholarship students are sponsored by the State Dept. The

students will receive a stipend for living expenses and full medical insurance. Families can be single parent, retired, etc and the student can share a room with a closely aged sibling.

Students come in August IF they have a family. This is a great way to bring cultural diversity into your world and create global citizenship.
